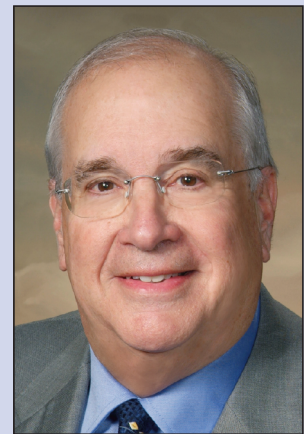

Auto Accident

On June 20, 1999, a van driven and filled with employees of Washington Inventory Service Inc., returning to their Richmond office, ran a red light and struck the car in which plaintiff was a passenger. She sustained a traumatic rupture of her aorta, requiring immediate emergency surgery, multiple pelvic fractures, liver lacerations, multiple rib fractures, pulmonary contusion, nerve compression in her left foot, scars and closed-head injury.
